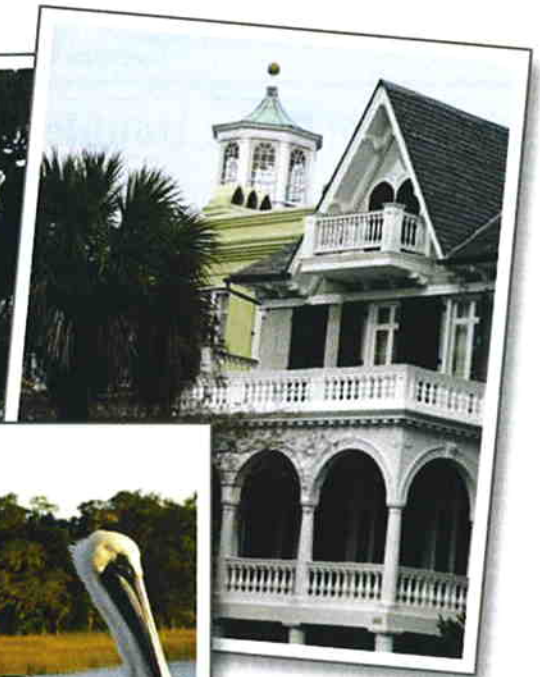

**Day 1: Sunday, May 01, 2011**

**Charleston, SC - Tour Begins**

Experience true Southern hospitality and charm in Georgia and South Carolina. Your tour begins in beautiful antebellum Charleston, where magnificent formal gardens grace much of the historic district.

**Day 2: Monday, May 02, 2011**

**Charleston**

Charleston has survived the Civil War, major fires, an earthquake and hurricanes – and still exudes elegance, charm and grace. Enjoy a guided tour of the city highlighting the cobblestoned streets, historic homes and restored buildings, some with origins prior to the Revolution. Stop at the battery overlooking Fort Sumter where, on April 12, 1861, the first shots of the Civil War were fired. Following your tour, experience southern plantation living as you explore one of America's oldest working plantations, Boone Hall plantation, set amidst moss draped oaks. View the remarkably preserved original slave cabins, unusual in their brick construction. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

**Day 3: Tuesday, May 03, 2011**

**Charleston - Beaufort - Savannah, Georgia**

Travel south along the coast through South Carolina's Low Country to the charming town of Beaufort, the "Queen of the Carolina Sea Islands." Perhaps you'll opt to explore Beaufort's charms in a horse-drawn

buggy or stroll around the streets at your own pace. Continue south to historic Savannah, home of the largest National Historic Landmark district in the United States. This afternoon, visit Savannah's Candy Kitchen, known for the packaging of the famous Paula Deen products, and enjoy a scrumptious tour of the factory to sample sweet southern delicacies such as pralines and peanut brittle. Wander this enchanting city's tree-filled squares, the City Market or the River Street shops at leisure this afternoon. Tonight's dinner features authentic southern cuisine at Mrs. Wilkes' Dining Room, a Savannah institution that has served hearty Southern fare - family-style - for over 60 years. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

**Day 4: Wednesday, May 04, 2011**

**Savannah - Jekyll Island**

Begin the day with a guided tour of Savannah's sprawling Historic District. Stroll along the cobblestone-paved Factors Walk and River Street, where old cotton warehouses have been converted into trendy shops, taverns and restaurants. Visit the beautiful Andrew Low Home and Gardens and learn about the driving force behind the Girl Scouts and its founder, Juliette Low. Travel south along the unspoiled Georgia coast of vast marshlands, winding rivers and beautiful beaches. Arrive at the exclusive Jekyll Island Club Hotel, grandly situated in

the midst of the fabled Golden Isles. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

**Day 5: Thursday, May 05, 2011**

**Jekyll Island - St. Simons Island - Jekyll Island**

Jekyll Island was the winter retreat of prominent gilded age families. Their grand "cottages" still stand. A tram brings you on a tour of the Jekyll Island Historic Landmark District - one of the nation's largest restoration projects. The Rockefellers, Vanderbilts and J.P. Morgan once summered here along the 240-acre river edge. Visit another of the fabled Golden Isles, quaint St. Simons Island. See its striking 106' tall lighthouse and visit the Museum of Coastal History. Later, enjoy leisure time to explore the quaint shops and restaurants in the village. *Today breakfast will be included.*



**Day 6: Friday, May 06, 2011**  
**Jekyll Island - St. Augustine, FL - Jacksonville**

Travel south to the United States' oldest city, St. Augustine, Florida, first settled in 1565. Enjoy time on your own to explore and learn about the city's rich heritage. You may choose to visit one of the many

museums, the Old Spanish Quarter, historic Bayfront, or "Old Town," which dates to 1572, or the Plaza de la Consitucion with its shops and restaurants. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

**Day 7: Saturday, May 07, 2011**  
**Jacksonville - Tour Ends**

Your days spent experiencing true southern charm and gracious hospitality will stay dear to your heart for years to come. *Today breakfast will be included.*

### IDENTIFICATION

#### Travel within USA

All airlines will ask for identification when you check-in. It is recommended that you carry a passport if you have one. A driver's license (with a photo I.D.) is also acceptable for domestic flights.

**Taxes and Fees:** Government and Other Authority Taxes and Fees are not included in base fare but are included in the tax amount listed: September 11th Security Fee up to \$10.00, Passenger Facility Charge (PFCs) of up to \$18 per passenger, Federal Domestic Flight Segment Fee of up to \$3.50 USD applies per passenger, per segment, US or International Departure and Arrival Fees. In order to better serve you, once you complete the booking process your invoice will display your vacation land package, base airfare, fuel surcharge and all taxes and fees as separate line items. Airfares are subject to change. Seats are limited and may not be available on every flight or departure date.

**Checked Baggage Charges:** Some airlines may impose additional charges if you choose to check any baggage. Please contact your airline or refer to its website for detailed information regarding your airline's checked baggage policies.
